Dear Mr. Johnson:

On April 20, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the National Agreement.

The question raised in this grievance involves whether management properly changed the swing routes.


After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. The parties agree that normally the changing of routes on a swing does not require the routes to be reposted for bid. Whether management properly changed the swing routes can only be determined by full development of the specific fact circumstances involved.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, if necessary.
