Dear Mr. Overby:

On August 7, 1981, you met with Frank Dyer in pre-arbitration discussion of H8N-5L-C-11249. After a thorough discussion of the issue, it was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full settlement of the case:


1. An employee may be required to report an accident on the day it occurs; however, completion of the appropriate forms will be in accordance with applicable rules and regulations and need not be on the day of the accident.
2. Any corrective action that may be initiated for failure to properly report an accident will have to stand the test of just cause on a case by case basis.

Please sign the attached copy of this letter acknowledging your agreement with this settlement, withdrawing H8N-5L-C-11249 from the pending national arbitration listing.
