## Dear Mr. Rademacher:

As a result of a pre-arbitration discussion on the abovecaptioned grievance, we have reconsidered the problem posed therein, and have reached the following conclusion:

The grievance is sustained. The per diem allowances to the particular grievants will be reinstituted and continued as long as they are assigned to the Fort Lewis Military Installation. The grievants will also be made whole for monies withheld since the allowances were discontinued.

It is understood, however, that these allowances are contrary to postal regulations and are being continued solely because there had developed a past practice as to the grievants. The practice will be discontinued when and if the grievants leave their assignments to the Fort Lewis Military Installation, and such allowances will not be paid to employees bidding on like assignments in the future.
