- The Postal Service acknowledges its obligation under Article XXXI of the National Agreement to provide the Union with information which is relevant and necessary for collective bargaining or the enforcement, administration or interpretation of the National Agreement.
- 2. The Postal Service agrees that relevant information within the meaning of Article XXXI, including requests for attendance information, will be provided to the Union, upon receipt, pursuant to the routine use provisions set forth in the description of the systems of records issued under the Privacy Act, 45 Fed. Reg. 1570, Sec. 050.020 (1980).

As the remedy to this grievance, the P. S. agrees to promptly provide the local with the attendance profile sheets for employees in the particular pay location requested.
