Dear Mr. May:

On October 7, 1975, we met with you to discuss the abovecaptioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

It is our position that advising carriers not to put the gear selector in the neutral position at each delivery point on a mounted route was improper. U. S. Postal Service policy in this regard provides that employees performing curb side delivery, from right hand drive vehicles, shall follow the procedures of (1) on level streets or roads, placing the vehicle in neutral (N), placing the foot firmly on the brake peddle while collecting mail or placing mail in the mail box; (2) on hills, placing the vehicle in park (P), placing the foot firmly on the brake peddle while collecting mail or placing mail in the mail box. We find that the grievance in this regard does have merit.

By copy of this letter, the Postmaster is instructed to comply with Postal Service policy concerning the operation of motor vehicles while delivering mail.
