On several occasions, the most recent being June 9, 1982, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.


The question raised in this grievance involves the COLA roll-in as provided for in Article 9, Section 3, of the 1981 National Agreement. It was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full settlement of this case:


The file reflects that the delay in processing the required forms was not the fault of the employee. The General Manager, Labor Relations Division, Western Region will provide the General Manager, Western Region E.L.R.I.C., with the necessary documentation which will allow the roll-in of this employee's COLA on a retroactive basis.
