On several occasions, the most recent being June 30, 1982, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The question raised in this grievance involves whether an Officer-In-Charge assignment is a supervisory position within the meaning of Article 41 of the National Agreement. It was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full settlement of this case:

An O.I.C. assignment is regarded as a temporary detail to a supervisory position within the meaning of Article 41, Section 1.A.2 of the National Agreement.
