Dear Mr. Johnson:

On November 22, 1982, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The question raised in this grievance involves the proper layout of the carrier throwback case. The dispute pivots on whether Exhibit 2-8 of Methods Handbook, Series M-41 or Exhibit 1-1 of Methods Handbook, Series M-39, should be utilized.


It was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full settlement of this case:


The date of Exhibit 2-8 of Methods Handbook, Series M-41 is June 14, 1974. The date of exhibit 1-1 of Methods Handbook, Series M-39 is January 30, 1981. Hence, local management was proper in relabeling the throwback case in compliance with the latest instructions. The postmaster is responsible for ascertaining that the carriers are instructed in the proper handling of all throwback mail.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to resolve this case.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
