Dear Mr. Johnson:

On October 6, 1982, we met on the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement.


The question raised in this grievance involves whether management violated the terms of the National Agreement by assigning a distribution, window and markup clerk to transfer information from Forms 3982 to new Forms 3982. It was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full settlement of this case:

The maintenance of Forms 3982, Changes of Address, is a function of the carrier craft as provided for in Part 240 of Methods Handbook, Series M-41. The parties at Step 3 will determine the amount of overtime due to each carrier, as if the carriers had performed these duties.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing. Please sign a copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
