On June 10, 1982, we met with your contractual grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The issue in this grievance involves discipline based on the results of a vehicle tachograph recording. It was mutually agreed to settle this case as follows:

No disciplinary actions will be taken based solely on information obtained from tachographs. However, the Postal Service is not precluded from possible use of vehicle recorder discs as evidence in disciplinary situations.
