Dear Mr. May:

On January 15, 1975, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The provisions for distributing mail as contained in the supervisor's job description refer to clerk duties and not the routing of mail into a carrier case. To this extent, we find the grievance is sustained.

By copy of this letter, the Postmaster is instructed to advise the Assistant to the Postmaster that the referenced bargaining unit work as contained in his position description refers only to those functions performed by distribution clerks and not the routing of mail into a carrier case.
