On June 4, 1985, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

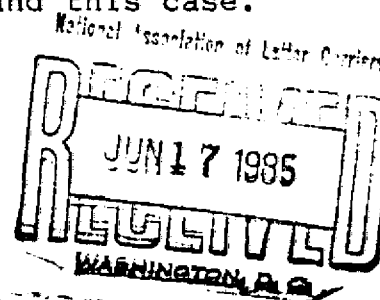
The issue in this grievance is whether management has violated Article 7 of the National Agreement by assigning special delivery messengers to pick up collection mail.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case.

The parties at this level agree that the key position description for special delivery messengers provides that special delivery messengers' duties and responsibilities include the delivery and collection of mail.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to Step 3 for further consideration by the parties.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.




