Dear Mr. May:

On April 13, 1976, we met with you to discuss the abovecaptioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

A supervisor is not prohibited from pointing out a carrier's shortcomings and giving appropriate corrective instructions. However, the union's request that the number of paces per minute be used as an observation and not as a specific criterion or standard of performance by the grievant is sustained.
