This letter is being furnished as per our agreement in the meeting that we held to discuss the Delivery Unit Volume Recording System.


Your concern that this system would be used by managers to replace the provisions of the [REDACTED] is addressed in Section I, Paragraph D, of Management Instruction, PO-610-79-24.

"Daily volume estimations recorded for individual routes in accordance with these procedures will not constitute the basis for disciplinary action for failure to meet minimum casing standards."

We additionally stated in our meeting, that the information developed in conjunction with this program would not constitute the sole basis for determining a carrier's leaving time.

We hope that this information alleviates your concerns in these areas.
