On May 26, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1981 National Agreement.


The question raised in this grievance involves whether carriers are properly being instructed to rework mail returned from the Central Mark-Up Unit.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. The parties agree that carriers may be required to rework mail from the CMU in accordance with Section 180 of the M-39 Handbook.


Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, if necessary.
