On several occasions, the most recent being October 25, 1983, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The question raised in this grievance is whether the grievant should be compensated at the overtime rate for the time he would have worked had he been able to complete Forms 1571 and 3996.

During our discussion, we agreed to settle this case based on our mutual understanding that the forms in question are to be completed on the day to which they apply. However, as the carrier was paid for the time when he completed the forms, no additional payment is warranted.
