On December 14, 1982, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

The question in this grievance involves the daily work assignments of reserve letter carriers vis-a-vis part-time flexible carriers.

As final settlement of all matter relating to this dispute, the parties at the national level agree to the following resolution:

Article 41, Section 1.B.4, of the 1981 National Agreement addresses how bids, including reserve letter carrier positions, should be posted. Pursuant to Article 41, Section 1.C.4, of the 1981 National Agreement, reserve letter carriers should work their bid duty assignment at the principal assignment area when there are eight (8) hour assignments available.

Please sign and return the attached copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to resolve this case.


