Dear Mr. Overby:

On June 9, 1982, we met on the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1978 National Agreement.


The question raised in this grievance involves whether a carrier is entitled to higher level pay when the assignment involves work on the Zip plus 4 Program.

After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. The carrier is entitled to higher level pay if the assignment involves coding, drawing sector lines of maps, completing data entry forms and placing sector segments on Zip plus 4 printouts. No higher level pay is justified when the assignment merely concerns the updating of existing maps or the placing of marks on maps for identification. The file does not identify exactly which duties were performed by the employee.


Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if
