Dear Mr. Overby:

On February 1, 1982, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.


The issue in this grievance was whether management was proper in changing the schedule of the assignment the part-time flexible received under the terms of Article 41, Section 2.B.4., of the 1981 National Agreement. It was mutually agreed to fully settle this case as follows:


1. The grievant was properly assigned in accordance with Article 41, Section 2.B.4., National Agreement.
2. The grievant should have worked the assignment in question for the duration without changing days off of the assignment.
3. Since the grievant worked on a scheduled day off, he should have worked six days in the week in question. Therefore, the grievant will be compensated for 8 hours of pay at the overtime rate in effect at the time the dispute arose.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
