Dear Mr. Johnson:

On April 3, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievances at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The question in these grievances is whether management has improperly instructed that "marriage" mail for delivery on park and loop routes be prepared while on the street.

During our discussion, it was mutually agreed that the following would represent a full settlement of these cases:


"Marriage" mailings received on park and loop routes are handled in accordance with the April 17, 1980, settlement concerning Simplified Address Mail. The carriers should case the address cards and carry the unaddressed mail pieces in the same manner as described in the April 17, 1980 Agreement, thereby having two bundles, letters and flats.


