On June 22, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure.


The question raised in this grievance is whether a part-time flexible city carrier may be required to perform clerical duties and learn schemes.


After further review of this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in the particulars evidenced in this case. The parties at this level agree that part-time flexible carriers may be assigned to perform clerical duties and may be required to pass examinations on schemes of city primary distribution if their assignment anticipates use of scheme knowledge as provided by Part 124 of the M-41 Handbook. The parties at Step 3 are to apply the above-cited provision to the specifics in this case in order to resolve the grievance.

Accordingly, as we further agreed, this case is hereby remanded to the parties at Step 3 for further processing if necessary.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
