Dear Mr. Johnson:

On May 2, 1984, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The grievance concerns whether a craft employee may on occasion be used to record Delivery Unit Volume Information (DUVRS). Also, the union requests higher level pay if such actions are authorized.

We find nothing in current instructions to preclude craft employees from occasionally recording the DUVRS information. The accuracy of their recording is apparently not challenged. Further, we find no requirement to pay higher level for performing this incidental activity.

Accordingly, as we find no violation of the National Agreement, this grievance is denied.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
