
As a result of our discussions on case NB-E-791,
PA-710-A-73(2), the U. S. Postal Service and the
National Association of Letter Carriers agree to
settle all grievances currently pending at any
step in which the issue is "whether as a result of
past practice, level 6 should be paid in instances
in which a Carrier Technician is scheduled to carry
a route, is absent, and the route is carried for less
than five (5) days by a city carrier," by paying the
grievant(s) level 6 for the day or days in question.

It is further agreed that henceforth, in all post
offices, if local management directs a city carrier
to carry a route which would otherwise be carried
by a Carrier Technician, and if the assignment is
solely to those duties contained in the job descrip-
tion of a city carrier, KP-11, that the city carrier
will only be entitled to level 5 pay for the day or
days in question.

This Agreement in no way supersedes or conflicts
with my memorandum dated November 5, 1973, to the
Assistant Regional Postmasters General on the subject
of Carrier Technician replacement.
