Dear Mr. Johnson:

On December 12, 1977, we met with you to discuss the abovecaptioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

Based on the evidence presented in this grievance, we find that time credit for cancelling stamps, reading the postal bulletin, and washing hands are not appropriate entries for line 21 of Form 1838. Those items are not daily recurring functions for which appropriate credits are already allowed in the standard.

Therefore, it is our conclusion that no violation of the National Agreement occurred and the grievance is denied.
