The subject Step 3 grievance was discussed with you on September 19, 1972 in accordance with Article XV, Section 2 of the National Agreement.

Management does recognize Collis Bosworth as the President, Branch #30 N. A. L. C. for the purposes of appealing grievance decisions to Steps 2b and 3.
