Dear Mr. Huerta:

On May 31, 1972, we met with you to discuss the above captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

After complete consideration of all facts as brought forth at the above noted fourth step here, the decision of the U.S. Postal Service is that this grievance was filed "in contract" as against discipline. Based on this determination, it is our decision that under Appendix C, proposal (24), "Revocation of SF-46", as outlined under "additional items agreed to by Postal Management-Union Negotiations" that the grievant was due those hours of work per day which did not necessitate utilization of a motor vehicle.

Therefore, the grievant shall be paid the number of scheduled hours per day which normally would have been devoted to casing and non-motorized activities.
