Dear Mr. May:

On February 4, 1976, we met with you to discuss the abovecaptioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

In accordance with our discussion of the particular fact circumstances in this case, it was mutually agreed that the T/6 Carrier will not be moved off his scheduled route unless absolutely necessary and all other alternatives have been made including calling in all qualified carriers in `an overtime situation. It was further agreed that the grievance is resolved on this basis.

We consider this matter settled without precedent and without prejudice to the position of either party, and it may not be cited by either party in any future grievance, hearing, arbitration or for any other purpose whatsoever.
