Dear Mr. Johnson:

On February 21, 1980, we met on the above-captioned case at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure set forth in the 1978 National Agreement.

During our discussion, we concluded that at issue in this grievance is whether the responsibility for the preparation of second notices for parcels is properly assigned to the Redmond, Oregon letter carriers is appropriate under the terms of the National Agreement.


Subsequent to the Step 4 meeting it was learned that employees other than letter carriers will be assigned the responsibility for the day-to-day preparation of second notices for parcels. With this understanding, the case is considered closed.


