On June 5, 1974, we met with you to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The matters presented by you as well as the applicable contractual provisions have been reviewed and given careful consideration.

Information in the file reflects that an employee bid on his former assignment while still detailed to a supervisory position in which he had served for over six months. This was not consistent with applicable provisions of the National Agreement. Accordingly, the appropriate postal officials are being instructed to take the necessary steps to see that the assignment in question is awarded to the bidder who would have received that assignment had it not been awarded to the employee with whom this grievance is concerned.

The grievance is sustained.
