Dear Mr. Overby:

On April 23, 1987, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management violated the National Agreement by using a handoff as a means of adjusting a route.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. Whether management properly adjusted the route by the use of a handoff can only be determined by application of Section 243.21 of Methods Handbook M-39 to the fact circumstances involved.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, if necessary.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
