Dear Mr. Hutchins:

On October 19, 1988, a meeting was held with the NALC Director of City Delivery, Brian Farris, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management properly utilized an acting supervisor on his non-scheduled day in a craft overtime assignment.

During our discussion, we mutually agreed that an employee serving as a temporary supervisor (204B) is prohibited from performing bargaining unit work, except to the extent otherwise provided in Article 1, Section 6 of the National Agreement. Therefore, a temporary supervisor is ineligible to work overtime in the bargaining unit while detailed, even if the overtime occurs on a nonscheduled day.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to settle this case.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
