On August 25, 1988, we met discussed the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether a reserve regular duty assignment must be posted for bid.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. We further agreed that a newly established reserve regular duty assignment must be posted for bid according to Article 41.1.A.1 of the National Agreement.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing in accordance with the above stated agreement.
