Dear Mr. Hutchins:

On December 8, 1988, I met with the NALC Director of City Delivery, Brian Farris, to discuss the above-captioned grievances at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in these grievances is whether the assignment of a Labor Distribution Code for work performed at a segmentation case necessarily determines the craft designation of the work.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in these cases. We further agreed that the fact that the work is being charged to Labor Distribution Code 43 is an administrative characterization of function which does not change the fact that the work being performed is carrier work.

Based on the above, we mutually agreed to close these grievances.
