Dear Mr. Sombrotto:

Recently, a meeting was held with the NALC Director of City Delivery, Brian Farris, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management violated the National Agreement by having an Input Data Clerk traveling from station to station and inputting data directly from case labels in an effort to eliminate the need for Form 313.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. We further agreed that regardless of the methodology employed to change the information contained on the Form 313, the actual work associated with making such changes on Form 313, is letter carrier work.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
