Dear Mr. Sombrotto:

Recently, a meeting was held with the NALC Director of City Delivery, Brian Farris, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management violated the National Agreement by its use of a "Checklist of Unsatisfactory Casing Procedures."

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. We further agreed that while the checklist is an appropriate means by which a supervisor may acquire and maintain a set of personal notes on the individual peformance of his subordinates, a carrier may not be required to sign the checklist.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
