Dear Mr. Johnson:

You recently posed a question as to the U. S. Postal Service's policy relative to left-handed individuals being required to cease left-handed distribution.

The Western Region has recently settled grievances concerning this issue, with another craft, as follows:

"As you know, we encourage right handed distribution. However, for those employees who have historically distributed left handed, there is no prohibition against continuing in such a manner provided such employees can orient mail properly in the case and perform assigned duties efficiently."

We are urging all other regions to consider this type language, plus a common sense approach in application, irrespective of craft, to current and future disputes of this nature.

I trust that this will satisfy your inquiry.
