Dear Mr. Sombrotto:

Recently, a meeting was held with the NALC-Director of City Delivery, Brian Farris, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management violated the National Agreement by permitting a carrier who "opted" for an assignment under the provisions of Article 41.2.B to work overtime, rather than a carrier on the overtime desired list.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for application of Arbitrator Bernstein's award in Case No. H1N-3U-C 10621, et. al.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
