Recently, we met to discuss the above-captioned grievances at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in these grievances concerns the delivery of express mail.


After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in these cases. During our discussion, we agreed the delivery of Express Mail is controlled in part by the provisions of Handbooks M-68 and DM-201.


Accordingly, we agreed to remand these cases to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.
