On September 12, 1991, we met the NALC Director of City Delivery, Brian Farris, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether a violation of Article 41.1.C.4 occurred in the use of routers outside of their bid assignment.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. Whether or not there were unanticipated circumstances involved is a factual dispute.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
