Recently, a meeting was held with the NALC Director of City Delivery, Brian Farris, to discuss the above-captioned grievances at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in these grievances is whether management violated the National Agreement by adjusting routes based on inspections performed using five-shelf cases.


During our discussion, we mutually agreed that, since the M-39 provides only for standard six-shelf letter cases, route inspections and adjustments should not have been performed on non-standard cases.

We further agreed to remand the question of remedy, if any, to step 3 for further processing.


Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.
