On December 21, 1992, we met with the NALC Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, William Young, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether Management violated the National Agreement by not allowing carriers to opt on a route while it was under consideration for reversion.

During our discussion, we mutually agreed that routes under consideration for reversion, when they are of anticipated duration of five (5) days or more, will be made available for opting until they are reverted or posted for bid.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this decision as your acknowledgment of agreement to settle this case.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
