Dear Mr. Sombrotto:

Recently, a meeting was held with the NALC Director of City Delivery, Brian Farris, to discuss the above-captioned case at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case.

During this discussion we mutually agreed, that in accordance with Article 41 Section 1.A.1, a vacant or newly established duty assignment not under consideration for reversion shall be posted within five working days of the day it becomes vacant. The Employer should provide written notice to the Union, at the local level, of the assignments that are being considered for reversion and the results of such consideration.

Consistent with the above understanding, we agree to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, including arbitration if necessary.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment to remand this case.

Time limits have been extended by mutual consent.
