Dear Mr. Hutchins:

Recently, you met with Dave Stanton in a prearbitration discussion of the above-referenced case.

The issue in this case involves revisions to ELM Section 355, which addresses light duty assignments.

During our discussion, we mutually agreed that ELM Section 355.1 will be revised by adding a new section which will read as follows:

355.14 (New Section)

The light duty provisions of the various collective-bargaining agreements between the U.S. Postal Service and the postal unions require that installation heads show the greatest consideration for full-time regular or part-time flexible employees requiring light duty or other assignments, giving each request careful attention, and reassign such employees to the extent possible in the employee's office.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to settle case H7C-NA-C 60 and remove it from the pending national arbitration listing.
