Dear Mr. Sombrotto:

Recently, a meeting was held with the Assistant Secretary Treasurer, Michael O'Connor, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of the contractual grievance procedure.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case.

During our discussion, we mutually agreed that language contained in the Step 3 decision adequately addresses the issue. Specifically stated:

There is no contractual prohibition to the supervisor being accompanied when he/she is being interviewed by the union during a grievance investigation.

Consistent with this understanding the parties agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for application of the Step 3 decision and further processing, including arbitration if necessary.

Please sign and return the enclosed copy of this letter as your acknowledgment of agreement to remand this case.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
