Dear Mr. Young:

Recently, we met with your representative in a prearbitration discussion of the above-captioned case currently pending national level arbitration.

The issue in this case is whether management violated the National Agreement when it assigned a PTF, letter carrier to perform duties in the rural carrier craft.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that city letter carriers may be assigned to perform duties in the rural carrier craft in emergency situations, as specified in Article 3.F of the National Agreement.

We further agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing, or to be scheduled for arbitration, as appropriate, consistent with the above understanding.

Time limits were extended by mutual consent.
