Recently, I met with your representative, William Young, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether management violated the National Agreement by not using current route inspection data in the implementation of Delivery Point Sequencing (DPS).


After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case. The parties agreed that route inspection data must be current for those offices implementing DPS, where there was no agreement or requested exemption to use their old route data.


Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing or to be rescheduled for arbitration, as appropriate.
