On August 24, 1995, I met with your representative, Jim Souza, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether Management violated the National Agreement by assigning overtime to a carrier on the work assignment list.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case.

The parties agree Reserve Letter Carriers and unassigned regulars who are on the work assignment list are eligible for overtime on the assignment on which they are working on a given day.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing or to be rescheduled for arbitration, as appropriate.
