On February 22, 1996, I met with your representative, Jim Edgemon, to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this grievance is whether Management violated the National Agreement by posting the office productivity information.

After reviewing this matter, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue is fairly presented in this case.


We also agreed that the data on the posting may not be used as the basis for discipline or for evaluation of routes.


Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing or to be rescheduled for arbitration, as appropriate.
