Dear Mr. Sombrotto:

On December 12, 1996, I met with your representative to discuss the above captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this case is whether management allowed a supervisor to perform bargaining unit work.

During this discussion, we mutually agreed that no national interpretive issue was presented.

The parties did agree that the Address Management Systems Specialist position description, in Item #4, provides for maintaining route delivery line of travel information, however, this does not include making unilateral changes in the carrier's line of travel.

Accordingly, we agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 for further processing or scheduling for arbitration as appropriate.
