On August 21, 1998, I met with your representative to discuss the above-captioned grievance at the fourth step of our contractual grievance procedure.

The issue in this case is whether management violated the National Agreement by not implementing the T-6 Program in the subject office.

After discussions and review of the Joint Contract Administrative Manual, which reflects that Article 41.3.D is obsolete, it is our decision to sustain this grievance to the extent that the T-6 Program will be instituted in the subject office.

We mutually agreed to remand this case to the parties at Step 3 to determine what remedy, if any, is appropriate.

This is to confirm the disposition of the subject Step 3 grievance appeal which was recently discussed with your representative.

Based on the information presented and contained in the grievance file, the grievance is DENIED. The decision of whether or not to implement the T-6 program in an office has been given to management as the result of discussions with the union at the national level. There is no basis for pursuing this issue at the local level since language in Article 41.3.D exists.

The time limit for processing at Step 3 was extended by mutual consent.

In our judgment, the grievance does not involve any interpretive issue(s) pertaining to the National Agreement or any supplement thereto which may be of general application. Unless the union believes otherwise, the case may be appealed directly to regional arbitration in accordance with the provisions of Article 15 of the National Agreement.



On May 15, 1998, we discussed the subject grievance at the second step of our grievance/arbitration procedure. The time limits for processing at Step 2 had been extended by mutual consent.

ISSUE: Has management violated the National Agreement by not creating a T-6 City Carrier position since there are five regular city routes in Olive Branch.

UNION POSITION: Union contends that Articles 41, 3.D and 7, 3.B instruct that a T-6 position is to be created when a delivery unit has five regular city routes.

**REQUESTED REMEDY:** As remedy, the union requests that management make a T-6 position in the Olive Branch post office retroactive to 3/28/98 and compensate city carriers for this position.

MANAGEMENT POSITION: The National Agreement says "The USPS may initiate the T-6 program in those offices in which the program has not been implemented." Such language is permissive but does not specifically require action; i. e. the call is management's.

**DECISION**: Based on the language in the National Agreement, the union has failed to show anything that requires management to fill a T-6 position when an office has five regular city routes. For this reason the subject grievance is denied. Should the union disagree with my decision and choose to appeal the subject grievance to Step 3, a copy of the Step 3 Appeal is to be provided to the undersigned as is required by the National Agreement.
